Sea

This half term our topic has been 'Adventures at Sea'. On our first day back we received a letter from Percy Parrot asking us to explore some objects/ artefacts that he had found. It was our job to find out what these artefacts were and where they came from. We discovered that they had come from the sea and the beach. We have spent our half term finding out lots of information about the sea and the different sea creatures that live there. We wrote fact files, described different sea creatures and even went on a pirate adventure at the dockyard. We are all now experts on all things under the sea.



In our last week of term we went on a trip to the Portsmouth Historic Dockyard to complete the Percy Parrot Workshop!







In maths this half term we have been exploring subtraction. The craft crab kept taking away golden coins from the treasure chest. We have learnt that when a part is removed from a whole the amount becomes smaller, less and fewer. We have been really creative in the way that we have recorded our take away

stories using a variety of resources and solving different maths problems.







This half term we have visited Portchester Castle to gather ideas for our own castle making. We explored the different parts of a castle and found out what it was like to live in one. When we returned to school we started to design and build our very own castles to put on display.

In English we have been collecting facts about castle workers and making chronological reports to share information. We have also learnt a castle poem and have enjoyed acting it out together.



In Maths we have been working on securing our addition and subtraction learning using number lines to show our workings. Next term we will move onto multiplication and division.

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We have come to the end of our 'Planet Earth' topic in Year 2, and have really enjoyed learning about different animals and their habitats. We finished with a trip to Marwell Zoo which the children have created fantastic leaflets for! Parents came in for a fun craft afternoon to build shoebox environments so the children could showcase their learning.

This half term in English we finished writing our own instructions on how to make animal masks. Since then we have been learning about fables and about how each fable has a moral. We even had a go at writing our own version of The Lion and The Mouse. We have also learnt how to use conjunctions to extend our sentences.

Last week we came across a strange collection of seaside objects in our quad and began putting the clues together. What could have happened?


We were fortunate enough to have a visit from a Marine Biologist. She told us about the effects of plastic in the sea and talked about how some




parts of the ocean have yet to be explored. We were thrilled to be able to have

of 10, 100, 1000 and whole number.







In English we've been practicing the skills we'll need to write our own cautionary tales. We re-capped how to write speech correctly, and wrote an exciting conversation between two characters based on a picture. We also wrote the battle scene from our warning story, using the tools from our toolkit to make it interesting and exciting.



Year TERRIB

In shared reading we have been looking at a mystical tale Krakus and the Dragon. We looked at where the tale came from and dived into its speech, talking about the effects of speech and how we could act it out.



In English we have been looking at Bedd Gelert (a famous Welsh story) and have been thinking about we could edit in more speech for effect. We spent time in role as Llewelyn and practiced what he might say to his faithful hound, Gelert. It was brilliant to watch and even more fantastic to see everyone then put it into written speech.



We visited the Mary Rose in the Portsmouth Dockyard and got to see all the different artefacts that were found. The ship had holographic videos of what the people on the ship would have been doing at that time. We also learnt about why the ship sunk.







So far, year 6 pupils have been involved in many fun, yet educational activities. This includes: a school trip to the Mary Rose, a selected group of children were invited to the Guildhall and athletic competitions. We were able to explore the human body in topic lessons. (Still able to complete our Mock SATS). Currently we are learning about diary entries. Earlier in the term, we witnessed a crime investigation about a loved TA's bike theft. We were given the task to plan and write a newspaper report as well as a diary entry informing readers about the events that occurred. Pupils have worked extremely hard to produce the best work possible.

In topic, Year 6 have learnt about the human body and how it works. They have also written posters, other pieces of writing and have been involved in a crime investigation linked to English. While learning about the human body, Year 6 have had lots of fun because of the type of work involved.

ENGLISH

During our English lessons Year 6 have become crime investigators alongside DCI Marabese to help publicise the case of Mrs Waller's stolen bicycle incident. The writing they have completed consists of newspaper reports and diary entries. While writing these pieces of work, the children have fully planned, drafted, edited and published them.

This is my first report as the Chair of Governors of Northern Parade, Kings Academies. Our first meeting will be in the first week of the new term. We say goodbye to two governors, Steve Sisman and Claire Rochester. Both of whom have served the schools well over a number of years and will both be missed.

In my last post I wrote:

"The children will see no difference in the way in which the way the curriculum is delivered and their experience at the school will continue as it is. As parents you will see no changes. However, improvements will continue to take place."

Apart from the new sign at the front of the school this has proved to be true. There have been a number of changes in the admin of the school but the School has continued its links with the wider community of Portsmouth schools, members of

our staff and those of our partner school of College park play a big role in school improvements across the city, particularly in the delivery of Maths and English.

The building work continues and over the break preparations to convert the final classroom for Year 6 will begin. This will be completed after the half term holidays and we hope that the children will have access to the new Learning Resources Suite soon after that. The staff will also be relieved to get their staffroom back after a break of three years.

When we began the expansion the Executive Head teacher was determined to keep any disruption to the pupils to a minimum. I think that we have achieved that and would like to thank all of the staff, both teaching and non-teaching, who have lost facilities over this period. I would also like to thank the parents and guardians who have responded to the changes in morning and afternoon arrangement over this time. In September with the new performing arts area complete we will see the results of this work.



The Rainbow Room is excited with the success of its Coffee Mornings for parents of ASD children. We are now engaging outside agencies at most sessions, professionals from CAMHS, Portsmouth Autism, Parent Voice and Occupational Therapists are either attending or about to attend.

Next term we will be turning our attention to transition as our Year 6 get used to the idea of leaving Northern Parade and moving on to Secondary School. Year 2 will be moving from the Infants to the

Juniors, and we will be meeting with all of the children coming up. We will also support other children who we know may find transition difficult.

We now have two official Loss Companions within the Rainbow Rooms to support children and families with loss and bereavement.
