




Living Museum

Our Values

- Teamwork Trio: The children will work together to research the Stone Age and make a presentation to their peers.
- Resilient Ruby: The children will practise and improve their painting techniques to re-create cave paintings.
- Independent Isaac: The children will produce independent writing using the language and vocabulary taught throughout the half term.
- Creative Christoph: Throughout the topic, the children will discuss their own ideas for presenting their learning and will design an end of term museum to present their learning.

<u>Autumn 1</u>

Ages Ago

<u>English</u>: We will be learning about instructional texts and will create our own using the example of 'How to wash a woolly mammoth'. We will also be doing lots of dictionary work to identify the meanings of new words which will help the children to widen their vocabularies.



<u>Maths:</u> This half term we will focus heavily on place value and the children will be exploring three-digit numbers using a wide variety of resources and exciting activities. Plus also drawing life size pictures relating to our topic (using scales) and ordering numbers, such as dates in chronological order.

<u>Science</u>: Mrs Creasey will be teaching Year 3 about the properties of materials, solids, liquids and gases, reversible and irreversible changes and comparing rocks/soils/fossils.

<u>History</u>: About the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age and how these changes have influenced the way we live today.

<u>Geography</u>: Human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activities (trade links), and the distribution of natural resources (energy, food, minerals, water).



<u>DT</u>: The children will be designing, making and evaluating houses or tools from the Stone Age period.

<u>Art:</u> The children will create their own cave paintings, drawings and sculptures using different materials and techniques.

<u>PSHE</u>: "Me and My Feelings" will be our PSHE topic for Autumn 1 and will involve discussions around managing feelings surrounding new people, seeing things from someone else's perspective and the qualities of a good friendship.

<u>R.E:</u> The children will be thinking about what it means to belong to a group and will relate this to their learning about the Christian faith, with a focus on baptism.

<u>ICT</u>: Children will be using a range of different presentational software programmes and ICT to research the Stone Age ready for our museum.

PE: Games and dance.

Spanish: Basic introduction to the language.
