Cleopatra VII The last Pharoah of

Egypt 69B.C.-30B.C.

Cleopatra's family were Macedonian

Greeks that ruled Egypt for 275 years, from 305B.C. to 30B.C.

Her ancestor was **Ptolemy I** (**Ptolemy Soter**). He was a *Macedonian* general, also a close friend and bodyguard of **Alexander the Great**.

Cleopatra's father was Ptolemy XII and he lost his throne in a revolt, led by Cleopatra's eldest sister Bernice IV In 58B.C.

He fled to *Rome* with his younger daughter Cleopatra but returned in 55B.C. and with the help of the Roman army, **Bernice** was defeated and then beheaded.

Ptolemy XII died in 51B.C. leaving Egypt to be ruled by his surviving, loyal daughter Cleopatra VII and her younger brother Ptolemy XIII. They shared power together but soon had a falling out that led to a nasty civil-war in Egypt. The Roman general, Julius Caesar tried to get Cleopatra VII and her brother Ptolemy XIII to make peace, but Ptolemy didn't trust Caesar, so he joined forces with Cleopatra's half-sister Arsinoe IV. He led an army that attacked Caesar and Cleopatra at their palace in Egypt, but more Romans came to Caesar's help and Ptolemy XIII was later killed at the battle of the Nile in 47B.C. Arsinoe was exiled (sent away) and Julius Caesar declared that Cleopatra VII should be queen of Egypt and share power with her even younger brother Ptolemy XIV.

Cleopatra had a son by Caesar called Caesarion.


In 44B.C. Julius Caesar was assassinated

(killed) in Rome while Cleopatra was staying there with her son Caesarion. Cleopatra then tried to have her son succeed Caesar as ruler, but power went to Caesar's great nephew and adopted son Octavian. (He was later called Augustus, Rome's first Emperor). She then arranged the murder of her younger brother Ptolemy XIV, to take full power in Egypt and joined with Roman general Mark Anthony against Octavian. (Cleopatra went on to have 3 children by Mark Anthony). They fought against Octavian in a great sea battle (The Battle of Actium in 31B.C.) in which Octavian's general Agrippa, defeated their fleet of ships. Octavian's army then invaded Egypt in 30B.C. and Mark Anthony committed suicide. Cleopatra, the last Pharaoh of Egypt also took her own life, and according to legend she deliberately let a poisonous snake bite her!
